

2025 DeKalb County Farm Bureau, Inc. High School Scholarship

About: Indiana Farm Bureau, Inc. was founded to improve the well-being of families working in agriculture and residing in rural communities. DeKalb County Farm Bureau, Inc. is making this scholarship available in honor of the leadership of those individuals who have served this organization well. It is our hope that the individuals receiving this award will be able to give back to their rural community in the future.

Eligibility: This scholarship is a one-time award (up to \$1000) to a graduating senior from DeKalb High School, Eastside High School, Garrett High School, Hamilton High School (DeKalb County residents only), or Lakewood Park Christian School (DeKalb County residents only). The applicant themselves or their parent or guardian must be a member of Indiana Farm Bureau, Inc. (either voting or associate). Applicants may pursue any field of study at a college, university, or technical school of the recipients' choice. In summary, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Be a resident of DeKalb County
- Be a member of Indiana Farm Bureau, Inc.
 - o Dependents qualify under the membership of a parent or guardian
- Be enrolled at an accredited college, university, or technical school

Requirements: Applicants must complete and submit these items to be considered for the scholarship.

- Cover page with student and parent/guardian signatures
- Application
- Essay questions
- Current transcript
- One letter of recommendation (from a non-relative)

Deadline: All of the required items listed above must be received in a single submission by **Friday, February 28, 2025.** They may be delivered to the DeKalb County Farm Bureau, Inc. office at 506 South Grandstaff Drive, Auburn, IN (Monday – Friday, 8:00am to 5:00pm).
